Martin Lewis is a multi-faceted player in the spheres of the arts and entertainment. With a fabled five-decade history working in music, comedy, film, stage, TV, radio & books. He has been a cultural alchemist with many of the leading musicians & comedic artists of the last half-century.

In his polymathic career he has been acclaimed for his work as a producer, publicist, marketing strategist, humorist, writer, journalist, political commentator, radio & TV host/contributor, comedic actor, creator/curator of film festivals, talent manager & pop-culture historian. He is noted as an exuberant, passionate operative - with a hands-on dedicated work style. He has also been a longtime respected activist for human rights, the First Amendment and other causes...

Born and raised in Britain, Lewis moved to the USA in 1982. First to New York City and then in 1988 to Los Angeles – where he still resides. 🎶 "In spite of all temptations – to belong to other nations - he remains an Englishman..." 🎶



Here is a comparatively concise summary of his extensive and packed 57-year work history: (Warning: This incorporates flashbacks and flash-forwards!)

- He is credited by Sting, Bob Geldof, Bono, Peter Gabriel & Pete Townshend with helping inspire their social & political activism by way of the groundbreaking "Secret Policeman's Ball" benefit shows, films and albums in support of human rights that Lewis co-created, produced & marketed
- He is credited by **Pete Townshend** with helping inspire the "Unplugged" phenomenon following Lewis' instigation, production & promotion of Townshend's historic, live acoustic performances in 1979 on stage, record and film
- He is credited by John Cleese with coining the iconic "Secret Policeman's Ball" title for the legendary series of benefit shows, films & albums that they co-created - all produced and marketed by Lewis
- He is credited by musician and gay rights activist Tom Robinson and Darryl W. Bullock (author of "David Bowie Made Me Gay: 100 Years of LGBT Music") and by Ryan Gilbey (longtime film critic of The Guardian) with being the straight man who helped nudge Amnesty International into adding gay rights into its definition of human rights to be protected
- He is credited by the duo widely-acknowledged as the world's most successful movie marketers in the 1990s and 2000s as being the person who taught them how to do impactful, effective marketing & publicity



An avid teenage Beatles fan, at the age of just 14 he was engaged by book publisher Heinemann's Editorial Director Roland Gant to curate the comprehensive discography for the first (and only) authorized biography of The Beatles - written by Hunter Davies. It was the start of a long career...

Age 18 he became a much-published freelance music journalist in the UK - for the weekly music periodicals New Musical Express, Disc and Record Mirror. He was then recruited and mentored as a publicist by former Beatles press agent **Derek Taylor** at W.E.A. (Warner-Elektra-Atlantic) Records UK. At W.E.A. he created his first promotional campaign – ground-setting work for the American art-pop duo **Sparks** - two years before their breakthrough hit.






At the age of just 20 he was then head-hunted and became a key member of the Transatlantic Records team that, in the early-mid 1970s, transformed that pioneering indie UK company and led to it being acquired in 1975 for a substantial sum by the Granada Media conglomerate. He devised & executed the publicity & marketing campaigns that broke many of the company's most successful and profitable acts and projects of the era - including Billy Connolly, Mike Harding, Gryphon, the Pasadena Roof Orchestra, Joshua Rifkin (playing Scott Joplin piano rags), the notorious satirical *Idi Amin* album written by Alan Coren - performed by John Bird - that the UK government tried to suppress. And the infamous Portsmouth Sinfonia - which he styled as "The World's Worst Orchestra". (Though many felt that to be an under-statement...) His successful campaign for the orchestra included working with their producer and clarinet-player - Brian Eno of Roxy Music. Though only aged 21 he secured massive global media coverage for the ensemble - including an in-depth TV profile on "CBS Evening News" with Walter Cronkite and their debut record being designated 'Comedy Album of the Year' by Rolling Stone

THE SECRET POLICEMAN'S BALL







Later in the 1970s & 1980s he co-created (with **John Cleese**), produced and marketed the iconic "Secret Policeman's Ball" series of benefit shows, films, albums and books for the Nobel Peace Prize-winning human rights organization Amnesty International - starring **Monty Python**'s **John Cleese**, **Michael Palin**, **Graham Chapman**, **Terry Jones**, **Terry Gilliam –** plus **Peter Cook**, **Dudley Moore**, **Jonathan Miller**, **Alan Bennett**, **Eleanor Bron**, **John Bird**, **John Fortune**, **Billy Connolly**, **Rowan Atkinson**, **Pamela Stephenson**, **Victoria Wood**, **Neil Innes**, **Peter Ustinov**, **Barry Humphries/Dame Edna** et al. Amnesty credits the series and Lewis's promotional campaigns for all his films and albums with helping transform it from being a tiny, low-profile, niche pressure group into a worldwide human rights campaigning network with a huge public membership - especially among young people.

He instigated incorporating musicians into what had initially been purely comedy galas - personally recruiting and producing **Pete Townshend**, **Sting**, **Jeff Beck**, **Eric Clapton**, **Bob Geldof**, **Midge Ure**, **Phil Collins**, **Tom Robinson**, **Donovan**, **Julie Covington**. He then personally brought further musicians into Amnesty's orbit – including: **Peter Gabriel**, **Paul Rodgers**, **Nils Lofgren**, **Mick Hucknall**, **Joe Perry**, **Seal**, **Billy Bragg**, **Howard Jones**, **Evan Rachel Wood** and **The Police**. For his shows Lewis secured the first-ever solo live performances by Townshend, Sting, Geldof and Collins







Lewis' "Secret Policeman's Ball" series is credited with inspiring many other musicians to become active for Amnesty and human rights – including Bono and U2. Bono spoke for many of his fellow artists - telling Rolling Stone in 1986: "I saw The Secret Policeman's Ball and it became a part of me. It sowed a seed..." Among the many artists who followed the pioneers of Martin Lewis' Secret Policeman's Ball series into supporting Amnesty: Bob Dylan, Bruce Springsteen, David Gilmour, Kate Bush, Lou Reed, Steven Van Zandt, Mark Knopfler, Jackson Browne, Bryan Adams, Led Zeppelin, R.E.M., Dire Straits, Sinéad O'Connor, Alanis Morissette, Miles Davis, Joni Mitchell, Willie Nelson, Patti Smith, Elvis Costello, Diana Krall, Bryan Ferry, Carly Simon, Kris Kristofferson, Eric Burdon, Robbie Robertson, Dave Stewart, Annie Lennox, Bonnie Raitt, Miley Cyrus, Steve Earle, Dave Matthews, Joan Armatrading, Marianne Faithfull, John Mellencamp, Avril Lavigne, Adele, Christina Aguilera, Lenny Kravitz, Ozzy Osbourne, Simple Minds, The Cure, Black Eyed Peas, Duran Duran, Green Day, Radiohead, Coldplay, Aerosmith, Tears For Fears, Sir Elton John, George Harrison, Sir Paul McCartney.







In 1980 he formed his own comedy record label - *Springtime!* - distributed by **Chris Blackwell**'s Island Records. He instigated, produced & released the first-ever recordings of UK's alternative comedy stars of the 1980s including all the stars of *Absolutely Fabulous, The Young Ones* and *The Comic Strip*: *AbFab* creators **Dawn French** & **Jennifer Saunders** plus **Rik Mayall, Ade Edmondson, Nigel Planer**, **Peter Richardson** & **Alexei Sayle**. Working closely with his pal **Peter Cook** he organized the first commercial release of the legendary satirical recordings made by *Private Eye* magazine in the 1960s & 1970s - featuring **Peter Cook, Dudley Moore, Barry Humphries, John Fortune, John Bird, John Wells, Richard Ingrams, Barry Fantoni, Willie Rushton, Pamela Stephenson.**







He conceived & produced the notorious "Iron Lady" satirical album that savagely lampooned UK Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher - written by Private Eye magazine's John Wells and co-produced by John Lloyd - producer of "Spitting Image" "Blackadder" & "The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy". (In a personal social encounter in Los Angeles in 1992 after Thatcher had been ousted from power - she encouraged Lewis to re-release the album. "You should reissue it! I think it'll find a much bigger audience now!") He produced and marketed the performance and comedy recording widely considered to be the finest of Peter Cook's career "Entirely A Matter For You" - Cook's spoof of the murder conspiracy trial of disgraced British political leader Jeremy Thorpe. The recording was later highlighted at the conclusion of the Stephen Frears film "A Very English Scandal" starring Hugh Grant as Thorpe.







As a film producer he instigated & produced "Foreign Skies" - the theatrical documentary of the 1985 visit to China by **George Michael & Wham!** - a film he chose and recruited **Lindsay Anderson** to direct. The film received its World Premiere at London's Wembley Stadium in front of 72,000 fans - still the largest-ever audience to attend a movie premiere. He also produced the music video for **Wham!**'s worldwide number one single "Freedom".









He was the last producer to work with director **Sam Peckinpah** - who he selected to film the first two music videos for **Julian Lennon**: "Too Late For Goodbyes" & "Valotte" (both award-nominated) and an in-depth film profile of Lennon. After Peckinpah's sudden and unexpected death of a heart attack in December 1984 during pre-production for the documentary - with the encouragement of his filmmaker friend, **Taylor Hackford**, Lewis took over as director - his debut in that role. The resulting film "Stand By Me: A Portrait of Julian Lennon" was critically acclaimed. Its World Premiere at New York's Carnegie Hall was attended by Julian Lennon, **Cynthia Lennon, Yoko Ono, Sean Ono Lennon** and Lennon's record producer **Phil Ramone** among many.

Following the critical acclaim for his 1985 documentaries of Julian Lennon and George Michael & Wham! he was commissioned by the newly-launched Rock and Roll Hall of Fame to film the first four Hall of Fame Induction dinners in NYC in 1986, 1987, 1988 & 1989 for the official archives. Among the many performers & icons he filmed giving speeches and/or performing in the legendary all-star jam sessions organized by Bill Graham were: The Beach Boys • Chuck Berry • Paul Butterfield • Clive Davis • Bo Diddley • Dion • Bob Dylan • Ahmet Ertegun • Roberta Flack • John Fogerty Aretha Franklin • Hall & Oates • George Harrison • Mick Jagger • Billy Joel • Elton John • Mick Jones (Foreigner) • Quincy Jones • B.B. King Ben E. King • Jerry Leiber & Mike Stoller • Julian Lennon • Paul McCartney • Yoko Ono • Roy Orbison • Les Paul • Carl Perkins • Sam Phillips Doc Pomus • Little Richard • Keith Richards • Smokey Robinson • The Rolling Stones • Paul Simon • Bruce Springsteen • Ringo Starr • Sting Pete Townshend • Jerry Wexler • Brian Wilson • Mary Wilson (The Supremes) • Steve Winwood • Peter Wolf • Stevie Wonder • Neil Young







Roger Daltrey and others for the project. He was Associate Producer & Marketing Strategist for the first-ever DVD box-set of *The Four Complete Ed Sullivan Shows Featuring the Beatles*. He was Associate Producer for Tony Palmer's acclaimed documentary "Vangelis: The Journey To Ithaka" - securing and interviewing Ridley Scott, Oliver Stone and Jon Anderson for the film. As a young producer he engaged Julien Temple to direct his first film to receive a full theatrical release. He was the last person to film legendary actor Glenn Ford - capturing Ford delivering a special greeting for his friends and admirers who would be attending his 90th birthday gala - an event in Hollywood instigated, produced and hosted by Lewis.








He was a key member of the producing team for the 2009 Kennedy Center Honors salute to Bruce Springsteen - recruiting Sting to perform at the gala - and working with Sting, Eddie Vedder and Ben Harper. He was engaged to undertake an even more extensive producing role for the 2010 Kennedy Center Honors tribute to Sir Paul McCartney - advising on musical repertoire, guest performers, presentation, and tributes to Sir Paul on film and in the event's official commemorative brochure. Musical guests Lewis worked directly with included Dave Grohl, James Taylor, Gwen Stefani, Steven Tyler, Mavis Staples and Norah Jones.





As a visionary with a pioneering spirit he is credited with dreaming up the idea for Amnesty International's 1988 global tour "Human Rights Now!" starring Bruce Springsteen, Sting, Peter Gabriel, Tracy Chapman, Youssou N'Dour - promoted by Bill Graham. A six-week, five-continent, fifteen-nation, twenty-concert tour of the world saluting the 40- anniversary of *The Universal Declaration of Human Rights*. The tour succeeded in quadrupling Amnesty's worldwide membership.

25 years later he instigated, curated & produced the 6-disc DVD box-set "¡Released! The Human Rights Concerts" featuring 30 artists - including: Bruce Springsteen, U2, The Police, Lou Reed, Peter Gabriel, Sinead O'Connor, Sting, Jackson Browne, Joan Baez, Radiohead, Jimmy Page & Robert Plant. These were the four sets of concerts staged by the US chapter of Amnesty in 1986-1998 - inspired directly by the Secret Policeman's Ball galas produced by Lewis in the 1970s & 1980s. He created and curated 5 hours of additional contextual content for the box set including rare performances by Coldplay, David Byrne, Mumford & Sons, Green Day. He set the worldwide distribution deals for the DVD box-set, the related CDs, the digital streaming and the World Theatrical Premiere at the Museum of Modern Art in NYC. He also devised and executed the worldwide marketing strategy for the project.






He was the Contributing Producer for Amnesty International's "Chimes of Freedom" 4-disc CD box set of **Bob Dylan** compositions celebrating the organization's 50, anniversary. For which he personally recruited & produced audio recordings and music videos with **Pete Townshend**, **Jeff Beck**, **Seal**, **Paul Rodgers**, **Nils Lofgren**, **Mick Hucknall**, **Joe Perry**, **Billy Bragg**, actress/singer **Evan Rachel Wood** - and the 92-years-young **Pete Seeger** - his last-ever recording - and his first-ever music video...








In 2012, he conceived, co-wrote (with **Michael Palin**), directed and produced a new **Monty Python** skit titled "Python Leg-acy" for which he recruited **Robert De Niro**, **Whoopi Goldberg**, **Kyra Sedgwick** & **Annette O'Toole**. Palin cast Lewis in an off-camera improvisational acting cameo opposite De Niro. The sketch was created as a bonus item for the Blu-ray of Amnesty International's "Secret Policeman's Ball – 2012" held at New York's Radio City Music Hall. The show was the latest edition in the series that Lewis co-created & produced in the 1970s & 1980s. In recognition of his pioneering role & his setting up worldwide video and digital distribution of the show, Amnesty designated Lewis as *Producer Emeritus* of the 2012 event. In this role he also recruited Pythons **Michael Palin**, **Terry Jones** & **Eric Idle** – and produced special sequences with them.






He conceived, produced and hosted "*Monty Python*: Lust For Glory!" – the official 25- anniversary celebrations of the comedy troupe - which took place in Los Angeles in 1994 and encompassed a comprehensive film festival of group, solo and pre- & post-Python movies and television – plus the first-ever concerts of the affectionate, Pythonic pastiche of the Beatles - **The Rutles -** at the iconic L.A. venue *The Troubadour*. With a blessing from **George Harrison**! Lewis personally arranged attendance from three generations of American comics to pay tribute to the Pythons - including **Steve Martin**, **Sid Caesar**, **Imagene Coca**, **Chris Rock**.







In 1996 – playing off the **Beatles** "Anthology" project for which he was the US marketing strategist - he instigated, produced & marketed the **Rutles** reunion album "Archaeology" for his friend **Neil Innes**. He personally recruited an eclectic array of guest stars to appear in the music video he produced to promote the album - including: **Peter Gabriel, Graham Nash, Cyndi Lauper, Richie Havens, Ben E. King, Gloria Gaynor, David Sanborn, Aimee Mann, Michael Penn, Al Jardine, Corey Glover, Stephen Bishop, Paul Williams, Nancy Sinatra, Pat Boone, Richard Belzer, Taylor Negron, Janeane Garofalo, Bill Maher, Slash - and Miss Eartha Kitt! In 2007 he instigated, produced & hosted the official celebration of the Rutles' 30 anniversary – getting all four members to attend the Hollywood event and perform live together for the first time ever.**







In 1999 he was one of the producers of BBC TV's 30, anniversary marathon celebration of **Monty Python** for which he conceived and produced a **South Park** tribute in which that show's cartoon characters performed an animated version of the iconic "Dead Parrot" skit. He also devised & produced a sequence in which South Park creators **Matt Stone** and **Trey Parker** appeared to have kidnapped and trussed-up the mother of Python **Terry Gilliam** – played by his real-life 92-year-old mother **Mrs. Beatrice Gilliam!** – in a mock bid to pressure Gilliam to give up his filmmaking career and instead direct episodes of their TV show! The Pythons loved it so much that they wrote a new skit to follow the kidnap sequence – with British police updating the public about the plight of Terry Gilliam's abducted mom. (Gilliam's comment about Lewis' sequence: "I'm deeply ashamed that Martin has revealed my mother's fetish for bondage!")



He became in-demand as a producer of music videos that teamed major artists with feature films. Among his music video credits: The Turtles for the 1986 John Malkovich/Ann Magnuson comedy "Making Mr. Right" • Chrissie Hynde & The Pretenders for the 1987 James Bond film "The Living Daylights" • Siedah Garrett for the 1987 Diane Keaton comedy "Baby Boom" • Bryan Ferry for the 1988 Michael J. Fox film "Bright Lights, Big City" • Eric Burdon for the 1990 Tom Hanks/Meg Ryan movie "Joe Versus the Volcano" • Aaron Taylor-Johnson for the 2010 John Lennon biopic "Nowhere Boy." He worked with Sister Sledge, Peter Frampton, Phil Collins, Pete Townshend, Julian Lennon, Simon Le Bon & Nick Rhodes of Duran Duran to promote Marisa Tomei's first film. Other artists for whom he produced music videos: Ozzy Osbourne, The Rutles, Joe Perry, Pete Seeger (his first & only music video), the Sex Pistols (who denounced & rejected his video made in collaboration with Max Headroom creator Rocky Morton!) He was both producer & director of videos featuring Pete Townshend, Jeff Beck, Seal, Julian Lennon, Evan Rachel Wood. In 1997 he was commissioned by Rhino Movie Music to create the first-ever official music video for Dooley Wilson's "As Time Goes By" to promote the first-ever soundtrack album of the 1942 movie "Casablanca" starring Humphrey Bogart & Ingrid Bergman. (Subsequently Lauren Bacall told Lewis of her love for the music video he'd created.)


Though primarily a successful producer since 1974, he also continued to be an in-demand marketing strategist. In 1982, he single-handedly devised and executed the marketing campaign that gave newly-formed US film distributor Miramax Films its first hit film – indeed its only successful movie in its first decade of operation. The campaign was for the special version Lewis had created for the US market of his own film "The Secret Policeman's Other Ball"

He wrote & directed a TV spot in which **Monty Python**'s **Graham Chapman** posed as the leader of a fundamentalist faction called the **ORAL** Majority – and called for the banning of the film "The Secret Policeman's Other Ball" because it was "the most disgusting, lewd, lascivious film since "The Sound of Music"! At the end he stands to reveal that he is wearing a pink tutu with garter belt and fishnet stockings. Long-versed in the arts of publicity and media, Lewis then leaked a photo of the tutu-clad Chapman to tabloid media. And was the anonymous **agent provocateur** who ruffled feathers about it with **Jerry Falwell**'s **Moral Majority**. As he hoped - this created controversy and led to multiple TV stations – including NBC - banning the TV spot for the movie!

Lewis' coup de grace on the campaign was to then get "Saturday Night Live" (an NBC program!) to show the entire banned advert in its "Weekend Update" segment in which host **Brian Doyle-Murray** then discussed the scandal with Graham Chapman! At the conclusion of the sequence both of them stand to reveal similar frilly garments on their nether regions! It would have cost over \$100,000 to run the TV ad nationally. Lewis secured the exposure for free. It was the season finale of SNL – hosted for the first time by **Olivia Newton-John** - and the show thus drew a huge viewership. Other media then 'rinsed and repeated' the story. The film became a big hit. The distributors took careful note of Lewis' unique promotional techniques and strategizing...







Lewis devised the name to bait the Moral Majority

"Back in 1982 when we were starting Miramax Films, Martin Lewis was the producer of what became our first hit movie – 'The Secret Policeman's Other Ball' starring the Monty Pythons. Martin had a background in publicity and marketing and came up with a great campaign for the movie, creating a huge buzz and getting us free publicity, which was crucial to the film's success. We learned a lot about publicity and marketing from our experience with Martin Lewis." – Hollywood Reporter - June 2000
















He was a key player in the Oscar® marketing campaigns for two films that won 'Best Picture' and multiple other Oscars at the Academy Awards: "The King's Speech" (2011) starring Colin Firth, Geoffrey Rush, Helena Bonham Carter et al - written and directed respectively by Oscar-winners David Seidler and Tom Hooper. (12 Oscar nominations - 4 wins). And the 2004 Paul Haggis film "Crash" starring Sandra Bullock, Don Cheadle, Matt Dillon, Brendan Fraser et al. (6 nominations - 3 wins). He also worked directly with actor Michael Caine on the Oscar® marketing campaign that helped Caine secure his second Academy Award - for "The Cider House Rules" (1999) (7 nominations - 2 wins). He worked with director Barry Levinson on the marketing campaign for his Oscar® winning film "Rain Man" starring Dustin Hoffman and Tom Cruise (1988) (8 nominations - 4 wins). He worked on the campaigns for the Costa-Gravas film "Betrayed", the Michael J. Fox film "Bright Lights, Big City" (1988) Diane Keaton's "Baby Boom" (1988) & the Bond film "The Living Daylights" (1988). He created the TV commercials for Keanu Reeves' breakthrough hit movie "Bill & Ted's Excellent Adventure" (1989)













In the 1990s he was chosen by his original mentor **Derek Taylor** to be the US marketing strategist for the "Beatles Anthology" and "Beatles Live at the BBC" projects. For the BBC album he enlisted promotional support from two pioneers who had inspired the early Beatles: **Chuck Berry** & **Carl Perkins**. His successful campaigns led to him subsequently being engaged by both **Sir Paul McCartney** & **Sir George Martin** to promote their own projects.








In 2000 - on behalf of his friend, Beatles movie producer **Walter Shenson** - he instigated the successful US theatrical reissue of the first **Beatles** film "A Hard Day's Night" - and served as the publicity & marketing strategist for the release. His campaign featured a retro-styled website designed as if it were for the film's original release... had the internet existed in 1964! For this campaign he won the world's most prestigious advertising award - The One Show Gold Pencil - the advertising equivalent of the Oscar®. He then spearheaded & produced the first deluxe two-disc DVD release of the film - interviewing twenty-nine members of the cast and crew - creating five hours of additional contextual content and the new documentary "Things They Said Today". He was also worldwide marketing strategist for the release. In 2014 his "Things They Said Today" documentary and the multiple cast & crew interviews he conducted & produced were reprised as the centerpiece of the Criterion Collection 50th anniversary Blu-ray edition of the film.



As a talent manager he discovered comedian **Alexei Sayle** and guided him to British stardom - producing his first album, his first home-video special, securing his first book publishing deal, instigating his first radio series that led to him winning the *Sony Radio Award* for best Comedy Show - and recruiting **Clive Langer & Alan Winstanley** (producers of **Elvis Costello & Madness**) to produce his iconic "*Ullo John! Gotta New Motor?!*" hit single. He has managed the World's Worst Orchestra – **The Portsmouth Sinfonia** - and its historic legacy since 1974. On occasion he acted as manager for two of his longtime friends **Donovan** and **Eric Burdon**.







Re-imagined for the UK market

In 1982 he took on the new mantle of independent film distributor for a movie that stirred his political passion. He organized the UK distribution of the US indie documentary "The Atomic Cafe" that satirized the absurd US government propaganda of the 1950s that a nuclear war would be survivable. He premiered the film with what became a riotous screening at the British Houses of Parliament in the presence of MPs and Lords - then in the midst of a raging debate about the placement of US cruise missiles in the UK. After his campaign the film was nominated for Best Documentary in the British Academy Awards.

At the age of just 21, he conceived & produced the first-ever rock concerts at two of Britain's most august cultural venues – *The National Theatre* and *The Victoria & Albert Museum*. At that same age he also instigated & produced a sold-out concert - with just six weeks' notice - at London's *Royal Albert Hall*. In 1976 he conceived & produced the official concert at London's *Royal Festival Hall* that celebrated the 50th anniversary of the world's first weekly music paper - *Melody Maker*. In 1981, to commemorate the 20- anniversary of Amnesty International, he conceived & produced the first-ever rock concert presented in the 900-year-old *Westminster Abbey*. A performance by the rock-classical fusion band **SKY** – led by guitarist **John Williams** and David Bowie/Lou Reed bass player **Herbie Flowers**. The incursion of rock music into the hallowed Abbey - where every coronation since 1066 had taken place - greatly displeased the Royal Family. Their plan for the upcoming wedding of **Prince Charles** and the future **Princess Diana** to be held at the Abbey - as most royal nuptials were – was abruptly canceled and the ceremony was instead held at the much less commonly-used *St. Paul's Cathedral*!







In 1975 he conceived and promoted the inaugural season of performances at the ultra-fashionable art-deco nightclub Biba's Rainbow Room in London's Kensington. The milieu and music evoked the sophisticated nightclubs depicted in the 1930s movies of Fred Astaire & Ginger Rogers and featured the Pasadena Roof Orchestra - whose revival of authentic 1920s & 1930s dance band music Lewis promoted to enormous success in the UK and Europe.





1988-1995, he was a prominent Board Member of the Los Angeles branch of the British Academy of Film & Television Arts (BAFTA) – and was latterly elected to serve as Chairman of the Board. He conceived BAFTA's now iconic Annual Tea Party for British Oscar Nominees and produced the first two star-studded gatherings – attendees included: Roddy McDowall, Maureen O'Hara, Elliott Gould, Anthony Andrews, Elton John, Jim Sheridan, Michael York, Nigel Hawthorne, Tim Rice, Richard Curtis, Martin Landau, Miranda Richardson, Helen Mirren, Alan Parker, Arthur Hiller. During his tenure on the Board, he instigated, produced & hosted multiple premieres and previews of new UK film and TV productions for the British Academy in L.A. He also instigated and hosted retrospectives of filmmakers such as Ken Russell and Nic Roeg. He moderated multiple post-screening discussions with prominent filmmakers. He also co-produced and hosted screenings of historic British films with his counterparts at the US Motion Picture Academy.







1993-2013 he was a Member of the Board of Trustees of the respected Hollywood-based, non-profit cultural organization the **American Cinematheque**. For which he created, curated, produced & hosted numerous film festivals, premieres, anniversary screenings, sneak previews and movie events. His annual "Mods & Rockers Film Festival" of 1960s-1970s-1980s music & comedy movies and documentaries was a cultural staple in Los Angeles for many years. He conceived, produced & hosted many events for the Cinematheque at Hollywood's *Grauman's Egyptian Theatre* celebrating the pop-cultural ties that bind Britain and America. These were presented as July 4th celebrations - a day which with his trademark wit he dubbed **CO**-Dependence Day!

He conceived & produced a special royal event for the 1988 UK/LA Festival titled "Hollywood Salutes British Comedy" attended by the **Duke & Duchess** of York (aka "Fergie") and multiple Hollywood stars including Jack Nicholson, Jack Lemmon, Roger Moore, Roddy McDowall, Stephanie Powers, Vincent Price, Coral Browne, Pierce Brosnan, Michael J. Fox and Joseph Cotten. He recruited Dudley Moore and Anjelica Huston to be the event hosts and wrote their presentations. The celebration was filmed for a successful prime-time UK TV special.

In 1990, he instigated & produced a musical tribute to **Michael Caine** as the grand finale of his British Academy Britannia Award. For the project he sought out, recruited and worked closely with legendary lyricist **Sammy Cahn** to create "What's It All About - Michael?" an affectionate spoof that adapted the lyrics of the **Burt Bacharach-Hal David** song "Alfie". To perform the song Lewis secured his friends **Dudley Moore** and **Patti Austin**. Lewis was one of the last people to work with Cahn. Among the distinguished guests at the event were **Roger Moore** and **Her Royal Highness Princess Alexandra**.

As a writer he has created speeches and presentations for: Peter Cook, Dudley Moore, Graham Chapman, Sir Michael Palin, Terry Jones, Neil Innes, Carol Cleveland, John Bird, Mel Smith, Sir Roger Moore, Patrick Macnee, Sir George Martin, Yoko Ono, Quincy Jones, Robert De Niro, Elliott Gould, Lily Tomlin, Anjelica Huston, Susan Sarandon, Sarah Jessica Parker, Jennifer Aniston, Teri Hatcher, Patricia Arquette, Zsa Zsa Gabor.







In 1998 he was the sole writer of the first-ever VH1 "Divas Live" TV special starring Aretha Franklin, Céline Dion, Mariah Carey, Gloria Estefan, Shania Twain and Carole King. He wrote presentations spoken by Susan Sarandon, Sarah Jessica Parker, Jennifer Aniston, Teri Hatcher, Patricia Arquette and Sting. He also conceived the acclaimed "You've Got A Friend" sequence - performed with just a grand piano and the voices of Carole King, Celine Dion, Gloria Estefan and Shania Twain. That unplanned song was required at the 11th hour after Aretha Franklin decided to drop one of her scheduled songs in a protest about the show's producer. The Aretha Franklin tribute that he wrote for Susan Sarandon to deliver was widely recirculated after Franklin's death.



He was invited to create & perform new material for the critically-acclaimed 1994 CD-ROM "Monty Python's Complete Waste Of Time" - joining **Neil Innes**, **Eddie Izzard** and **Douglas Adams** in the rare distinction of being a non-Python member to both write & perform on an official **Monty Python** production.



In 2024 he served as one of the Master of Ceremonies (with **Sanjeev Bhaskar**) of "How Sweet To Be An Idiot" - the memorial concert at London's O2 Centre for his friend **Neil Innes** – featuring performances by other pals including **Michael Palin** and **Terry Gilliam** of **Monty Python**. He was also one of the event's instigators and producers.



Arising from their close friendship since 1972, **Pete Townshend** chose Lewis to be the person to present him with the *Les Paul Award* at NAMM's 28th annual *TEC Awards (Technical Excellence & Creativity)* in L.A. in 2013. In addition to delivering his laudation (with quite a few quips) Lewis instigated and produced a musical tribute to Townshend featuring live performances by his pals **Eric Burdon**, **Julia Fordham**, **Laurence Juber**. He also personally secured special tributes for the event from two of Townshend's peers - **Sir Paul McCartney** and **Sir Mick Jagger**. Lewis later recalled that he was "proud to have arranged for a member of **The Who** to be saluted by a **Beatle**, a **Stone** and an **Animal**!"







As an occasional comedic actor he has performed opposite notable thespians including two Oscar winners - Robert De Niro and Shelley Winters - and Sharon Stone, Mike Myers, Sean Young, Taylor Negron. He appeared in TV shows with Lynn Redgrave, Richard Lewis, Stan Freberg, Sherilyn Fenn, Tom Arnold, Ed McMahon, Dick Clark, "Weird Al" Yankovic. He was a co-star of the pioneering HBO satirical series spoofing TV news: "Night Rap". He has been directed by Sam Peckinpah, Lindsay Anderson and Martin Scorsese...







He was chosen by his friend, longtime Bruce Springsteen guitarist and consigliere Steven Van Zandt, to host his own daily, 4-hour national radio show on Van Zandt's Sirius Satellite Radio channel "The Underground Garage". Previously he had produced & hosted his own radio show in Los Angeles on KGIL. Live quests he personally secured and interviewed on his show included: Mike Myers, Drew Barrymore, Martin Landau, Kathy Bates, Bill Maher, Tom Arnold, Yoko Ono, Michael York, Lynn Redgrave, Michelle Phillips, Dinah Manoff, Janeane Garofalo, Sid Caesar, Leonard Maltin, Arianna Huffington, "Weird Al" Yankovic, Jeff Lynne, Robin Leach, Kato Kaelin, Sting and Slash.

At the age of 14, Martin Lewis stole his first kiss, murdered his Latin teacher - and wrote four songs recorded by the Beatles...

His critically-acclaimed autobiographical one-man show "Great Exploitations! An Audience With Martin Lewis" was selected for the 9th Annual Toyota Comedy Festival in New York in 2001 - as part of a festival lineup that included Spinal Tap, the Smothers Brothers, Richard Belzer, Bill Maher, Robert Klein, Alan King, Al Franken and Lewis Black. The show was also presented in Los Angeles where it became the first-ever theatrical presentation at the Steven Spielberg Theatre in Hollywood. He received guidance on the show's structure & presentation from several admirers including comedian Jerry Lewis (no relation), actress Dinah Manoff, comedy writer Bruce Vilanch & actor/director Charles Nelson Reilly.

He has been an in-demand interviewer and moderator of discussions at film festivals and cultural events. And a popular Master of Ceremonies for award shows, fundraisers, tributes and memorials. A list of over 360 of the luminaries he has interviewed/conversed with on-stage, on-camera or on-air - and/or formally introduced on-stage is attached in Addendum Two - at the foot of this document.

As a passionate believer in nurturing respect for music pioneers - he helped foster revivals of two bands that each had a pivotal role in music history:

In 1997 he helped galvanize the reunion of the original 1957-1959-era members of **John Lennon**'s first group **The Quarrymen** (the band that eventually evolved into the Beatles) and in succeeding years he arranged US tours, prominent concerts and TV exposure for them. He ensured that they were prominently featured in the US celebrations of the 70th anniversary of Lennon's birth. They are still performing in 2025. He produced the recording of them that was chosen by director Michael Lindsay-Hogg to use for the poignant finale of his film "Two Of Us" about the last day spent together by **John Lennon** & Paul McCartney in Manhattan in 1976. Lewis recorded them performing "Come Go With Me" – the song that in 1957 sparked Paul's interest on the *first* day that he met John.





In 2005 he orchestrated the reunion, extensive international accolades and belated expressions of respect for the original members of Bill Haley's first incarnation of **The Comets**. He arranged for them to be inducted into the Los Angeles *RockWalk*. He instigated and produced their appearances at New York's Museum of Modern Art and L.A.'s Viper Room (making the octogenarian band that venue's oldest-ever performers). He instigated their association in 2005 with NASA whose Deep Impact space mission intentionally crashed a projectile into a comet – on the exact 50 anniversary of the Comets' "Rock" Around The Clock" becoming the first-ever rock record to crash to the top of the Billboard charts. He instigated, produced & hosted the band's concert at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratories in California that celebrated the achievements of both NASA and the Comets. He conceived & organized "Rock Is Fifty!" & "Rock-Around-The-Clock-Athon!" events in NYC & L.A. Following all these accolades and attention the original band The Comets were finally inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in their own right in 2012. (They had not been included when Haley was posthumously inducted in 1987)

And a frequent contributor and occasional host for multiple radio & TV shows in the USA & UK. He has been a co-host of American TV specials focused on the *Academy Awards* and the *Golden Globes*. He has written, hosted & produced US TV specials of the *Brits* (the British Grammys) and about the **Beatles**. PROMOTER OF ROOTS & ESOTERIC MUSIC

In the early 1970s, he was very active in promoting niche and esoteric genres of music to the UK media and public. Among these were the primary strands of American roots music - folk, blues, ragtime, jazz, bluegrass, cajun, zydeco, gospel - contemporary classical and avant-garde music and pioneering early incarnations of World Music - field recordings made in Asia, Africa, the Caribbean, Central & South America and Eastern Europe.

His responsibilities as publicity & marketing director for the UK-based Transatlantic Records - which acted as distributor for multiple US indie labels - included proselytizing the virtues of acclaimed specialist US record labels including: Folkways, Arhoolie, Blue Goose, Yazoo, Matchbox, Roots, Douglas, Milestone, Prestige, Blue Note, Blues Classics, Audio-Fidelity, Nonesuch, Nonesuch Explorer - and Tony Bennett's jazz label Improv. And promoting niche UK record labels such as: Leader, Trailer, Rubber, Village Thing, Saydisc, Black Lion, Tangent, Big Ben

His work resulted in broader exposure in Britain for seminal blues, folk, ragtime, bluegrass and cajun artists including: Leadbelly, Muddy Waters, Willie Dixon, Sonny Terry & Brownie McGhee, Big Bill Broonzy, Howlin' Wolf, Little Walter, T-Bone Walker, Son House, Jimmy Reed, Lightnin' Hopkins, Memphis Slim, Bo Diddley, Blind Willie McTell, Furry Lewis, John Fahey, Mississippi Fred McDowell, Mississippi John Hurt, Rev. SOCIAL & POLITICAL ACTIVISM

In the 1970s and early 1980s he was an early proponent and activist for the UK's left-of-center *Labour Party* to modernize its then notably archaic marketing and presentation – winning plaudits for his political advertising campaigns from such ideologically-disparate party figures as centrist **Prime Minister James Callaghan** & left-wing firebrand **Tony Benn MP** - and from two future Labour Party leaders: **Neil Kinnock MP** & **John Smith MP**.

After he moved to the USA he found multiple ways to support Democratic Party politicians such as **Bill Clinton**, **Al Gore**, **John Kerry**, **Barack Obama**, **Hilary Clinton**, **Joe Biden**, **Kamala Harris**. He became active as a political commentator and satirist on TV shows on **CNN**, **MSNBC**, **CNBC**, **Fox News**, **Comedy Central**'s *Politically Incorrect* and **HBO**'s *Real Time With Bill Maher*. And in columns he wrote for **Time Magazine**, **Huffington Post**, **Salon**. During the Clinton impeachment he became a fixture on cable TV news defending the President. He was noted for orally lacerating Bill Clinton persecutors such as **Rep**. "B-1" **Bob Dornan**, **Susan Carpenter-McMillan**, **Larry Klayman**.

In 1982 he worked with legendary human rights activist and US Presidential Medal of Freedom winner, **Ginetta Sagan** and Amnesty International to present the "Banned Film Festival" of movies that had been censored throughout the world.

In 1992 he instigated, produced and hosted a major anti-censorship event in Hollywood with famed First Amendment attorney and civil libertarian **Martin Garbus** to promote the proscribed documentary "Damned in the USA" which examined the censorship of works by **Robert Mapplethorpe**, **Andres Serrano** and **Madonna** - in defiance of the film itself being quite literally damned and banned in the USA by dint of legal action from extreme right-wing evangelist **Rev. Donald Wildmon**.

As a longtime supporter of women's rights he was a popular host of the annual fundraising benefit show in L.A. for the *Women's Reproductive Rights Assistance Project* (WRRAP) - at that time the largest national, independent, nonprofit abortion fund in the U.S. He hosted the show on three occasions. He has also assisted in the production and promotion of the shows. In his role as emcee he introduced a large number of America's top comedic talents including **Robin Williams**.

On a primetime appearance he made on the *Fox News Channel* during the height of the 2000 presidential election he generated a furore ("good trouble" - © Rep. John Lewis) by getting the program to air a campaign commercial he had created - ostensibly in support of **George W. Bush** - which was a montage of the candidate very audibly sniffing and snorting during public appearances. Concluding with the caption: "Paid for by Bolivians For Bush"!

In 2003 he assisted in the short-notice production on the London stage of a satire protesting the impending Iraq War "The Madness of George Dubya". He secured songs for the show from his friend, legendary satirist **Tom Lehrer** - even getting Lehrer to write brand-new lyrics to his famous 1964 song "Send The Marines"

In the 2000 presidential election campaign - after Democrats were attacked for the playing of a Billy Joel song at a rally - Lewis responded by writing an expose in Time Magazine about the Bush campaign's frequent use of music by convicted pedophile **Gary Glitter**. The singer had recently been imprisoned for downloading over 4,000 indecent images of children as young as two being abused. The embarrassed Bush team immediately withdrew Glitter's music - publicly declaring "now his background has been explained to us, you will not hear it again at a Bush rally." Notwithstanding that promise, four years later the Bush 2004 campaign started again using music of Gary Glitter. Once more Lewis was the person who publicly exposed Bush's fondness for Glitter. This time making sure that far-right groups such as the "Christian Coalition" (sic) and the "Family Research Council" (sic) were also made aware that Bush's 'compassionate conservatism' (sic) included giving yet another chance to a sixty-year-old pedophile who had recently been deported from Cambodia because of his gross sexual abuse of young boys and girls.

In 2004, in support of US presidential candidate **Senator John Kerry**, he uncovered, investigated and wrote a major news story - published in *Salon* - that exposed the latest mendacity of *Swift Boat* smear creator **John O'Neill** - the right-wing thug who resurfaced in 2004 trying to complete the character assassination of Kerry that **Richard Nixon** had recruited him to undertake in 1971. (And that had failed then). Lewis researched, wrote & published his expose within 24 hours of the first *Swift Boat* TV ad airing - as his personal 'rapid response' and defense of Kerry in the vacuum of silence because Kerry was trying to take the high road and ignore the smears. On a lighter campaign note, he also instigated & produced the live reunion performance on CNN of Kerry's high school garage rock band **The Electras.**

In 2009 he became a thorn in the side of Republican politician **Chris Christie** when he blew the whistle on Christie's purloining of a **Monty Python** skit for a TV commercial promoting his gubernatorial campaign. Lewis exposed the copyright theft in a front-page *Huffington Post* news story and secured witty condemnations from Pythons **Terry Jones** and **Michael Palin** ("Christie is obviously confusing me with Sarah Palin…") that resulted in Christie constantly having to defend himself from media for the rest of his campaign on the topic of his stealing from Monty Python…

In 2012 - as part of his campaigning work for **President Barack Obama** - he created a commercial ostensibly in support of GOP presidential nominee **Mitt Romney** - deploying **David Leisure** in his iconic role as the fictional **Joe Isuzu** - the pathologically lying pitchman who made outrageous and overinflated claims about Isuzu cars. The spoof ad won many plaudits from political commentators such as MSNBC's **Chris Matthews** and **David Corn** of *Mother Jones Magazine*.

During the first presidency of **Donald Trump**, Lewis became a frequent guest on TV shows - offering biting satirical commentary. One of his appearances on **Joy Reid**'s **MSNBC** show was viewed by Trump who became so enraged by Lewis' lampooning of him that he live-tweeted his disgust. Lewis was branded "Fake News" - the ultimate Trump honorific! At the end of the segment Reid proclaimed: "Martin Lewis... You are a national treasure... You're an INTERNATIONAL treasure. Actually... you're an INTERCONTINENTAL treasure!!!" In 2017 he championed the US publication of the satirical book "Pussy" by award-winning British novelist **Howard Jacobson** - the first book to define **Donald Trump** as a psychotic, perpetually-infantile malignant narcissist. He also spearheaded its US marketing & publicity.

As an enjoyable sidebar to the many other roles in his polymathic career he has had an extensive history working on Beatles-related projects as a producer, writer, historian, consultant and as a marketing strategist. He is considered to be among the world's leading Beatles scholars. In 2014 he was commissioned by **Encyclopedia Britannica** to write its first new essay about the band in 50 years.

His multiple Beatles-related credits include being both the producer and the marketing strategist for the first deluxe two-disc DVD edition of their first film "A Hard Day's Night" (2002) – featuring five hours of new interviews and contextual content filmed by Lewis - including his acclaimed new documentary "Things They Said Today." Lewis undertook the twin roles at the personal request of the film's original producer, his friend **Walter Shenson**. He fulfilled similar functions - as Associate Producer and marketing strategist - for the DVD box-set of "The Beatles On Ed Sullivan" (2004). He conceived, wrote, hosted & produced the only TV documentary made about the "Beatles Anthology" - "Re-Meet The Beatles" (1995 - E!) shortlisted for consideration Best Documentary in the 1996 Emmy Awards.

He was consultant and US marketing strategist for "The Beatles Anthology" (1995-1996), "Live At The BBC" (1994), the US theatrical reissue of "A Hard Day's Night" (2000), Sir Paul McCartney's "Music & Animation" DVD (2004), Sir Paul McCartney's "Rupert and the Frog Song" TV short (1986), Sir Paul McCartney's "The Real Buddy Holly Story" documentary (1986), Sir George Martin's "In My Life" album (1998), Michael Lindsay-Hogg's film "Two Of Us" (2000) [for which he was also Music Supervisor], Julie Taymor's Beatles-themed movie "Across The Universe" (2007) and Sam Taylor-Wood's John Lennon biopic "Nowhere Boy" (2010). He has worked as producer-writer-host and/or consultant and/or publicity & marketing strategist on various film, TV, DVD, record, radio and stage projects with Sir Paul McCartney, Sir Ringo Starr, Yoko Ono, Sir George Martin, The Quarrymen (since 1997), Julian Lennon and The Rutles.

In 1997, he co-produced the official 40 anniversary celebrations in Liverpool of the 'big bang' day in Beatles history in July 1957 when John Lennon and Paul McCartney met for the first time – personally securing special messages for the event from **Sir Paul McCartney**, **Yoko Ono**, **US President Bill Clinton**, **UK Prime Minister Tony Blair** and **Her Majesty the Queen**.

In 2002 he worked closely with his friend, legendary Beatles photographer/designer **Robert Freeman**, to create a new photographic tableau drawn from Freeman's archive of unseen Beatles photos. He commissioned the unique frieze as a special Limited Edition artwork to accompany the initial pressing of the deluxe two-disc DVD edition of "A Hard Day's Night" that he produced.

In 2004 he instigated and produced *The Fab 40* - the 40^a anniversary celebrations of The Beatles' first US visit - which included multiple events in New York City & Washington DC – including celebrations he hosted & produced at *Lincoln Center, The Museum of TV & Radio (the Paley Center), The American Film Institute* and – co-hosting with his friend **Steven Van Zandt** – at the NYC *Hard Rock Cafe*. Also in 2004, he instigated & hosted the private 40^a anniversary cast & crew reunion in London of "*A Hard Day's Night*" - attended by **Sir Paul McCartney** and multiple cast and crew members on the exact 40^a anniversary of the film's World Premiere.

In 2005 he instigated, produced & hosted special screenings of restored versions of "A Hard Day's Night" and "Yellow Submarine" in the legendary Studio 2 of Abbey Road Studios - where the music for those films had been created. For the latter film he curated a rare panel discussion among the surviving animators and Liverpool poet **Roger McGough** - who wrote much of the dialogue spoken by the animated versions of John, Paul, George & Ringo.

In 2008 he instigated & organized the US space agency **NASA** beaming the Beatles' song "*Across The Universe*" literally 'across the universe' - into deep outer space (with special blessings he secured from **Sir Paul McCartney & Yoko Ono**) on the 40- anniversary of that song being recorded. The event attracted worldwide media attention & plaudits from the Beatles' inner circle including Paul, Yoko, **Sir George Martin** & from space aficionado & entrepreneur **Sir Richard Branson**

In 2010 he instigated, produced and hosted multiple celebrations of John Lennon's 70. birthday - including the US Premiere of the film "Nowhere Boy" & the NYC benefit concert for Amnesty International held on the exact anniversary. It starred many performers personally invited to appear by Lewis - including The Quarrymen, Pete Seeger, Tom Paxton, Neil Innes, Earl Slick, Marshall Crenshaw, Tom Chapin, Mark Hudson, Garland Jeffreys. He also instigated and curated Nowhere Boy - a major photographic exhibition of rare childhood photos of John Lennon displayed at the Paley Center in New York.

He was a key member of the producing team for the 2010 *Kennedy Center Honors* tribute to **Sir Paul McCartney** - advising on musical repertoire, guest performers, presentation and tributes to Sir Paul on film and in the event's official commemorative book. Musical guests Lewis worked directly with included **Dave Grohl, James Taylor, Gwen Stefani, Steven Tyler, Mavis Staples & Norah Jones.**

He also hosted & produced the major celebrations of the golden anniversary of the Beatles' first US visit at New York's 92nd Street Y cultural center. Guests he invited to appear on the panel he moderated were **Peter Asher, Donovan, Billy J. Kramer, Denny Laine** & Beatles fan-club chief **Freda Kelly**

In 2014, he was chosen to be Senior Producer of CBS' official 50th anniversary celebration of the Beatles' first appearance on the *Ed Sullivan Show* – a live webcast that took place on the exact same stage of the Ed Sullivan Theatre on the exact 50th anniversary starting at the exact same 8:00pm slot on the Sunday night. Among the guests he proposed and secured to speak on the panels he curated were: **Pattie Boyd, Peter Asher, Neil Innes, Nile Rodgers, Mick Jones** (Foreigner), **Felix Cavaliere** (The Rascals), **John Oates** (Hall & Oates) and "Across The Universe" director **Julie Taymor**.

He was commissioned to write the special essay commemorating the 50th anniversary of "A Hard Day's Night" for the 2014 TCM Film Festival and was invited by **Alec Baldwin** to be his special on-stage guest discussing the film at the festival's gala anniversary screening at the Chinese Theatre in Hollywood. The 50th anniversary edition Blu-ray edition of the film reprised his 2002 documentary "Things They Said Today" as its centerpiece.

In 2019, he instigated, produced and hosted the first-ever retrospective of the films produced by **HandMade Films** - the boutique movie studio created by **George Harrison** - initially to finance the making of **Monty Python**'s "Life of Brian". The two-week salute took place in Los Angeles and included the US Premiere of "An Accidental Studio: The Story of HandMade Films". Among the many high-profile individuals who accepted Lewis's personal invitation to attend the celebrations in Los Angeles of George Harrison's considerable contributions to the film world were **Pete Townshend**, **Tim Rice**, **Peter Asher**, **Kathy Bates**, Harrison's sister-in-law **Linda Arias**, Monty Python film producer **John Goldstone** and movie mogul **Mike Medavoy**.

In 2024 - to commemorate the 60th anniversary of the Beatles' historic first concert at the *Hollywood Bowl* he instigated and produced a celebration at the *Philosophical Research Society* in Los Angeles - just four miles from the venue of the iconic 1964 show. The event featured a TED Talk by Lewis titled "The Greatest Beatles Story NEVER Told! The Untold Tale Of How The Beatles Beguiled America". The evening included the World Premiere of a previously unheard artifact from the 1967 "Sqt. Pepper" sessions and a live performance from Paul McCartney & Wings guitarist **Laurence Juber**.

In 1998 - inspired by his respect for Beatles manager **Brian Epstein** - who he regards as a comparatively under-sung and overlooked hero in the Beatles story - he instigated and subsequently led the worldwide campaign to have Epstein inducted posthumously into the non-performers' section of the *Rock And Roll Hall Of Fame* – the *Ahmet Ertegun Award*. Lewis proselytized the case for Epstein's inclusion within the music industry, in the media and among the public. After sixteen long years, the campaign eventually succeeded and Epstein was finally and belatedly inducted into the Hall of Fame in April 2014. Multiple media outlets – including the *Los Angeles Times, USA Today* and *BBC* – credited Lewis' crusade for the successful outcome.

As part of his campaign he played a pivotal role in orchestrating the 1998 reissue of Epstein's 1964 autobiography "A Cellarful Of Noise" by Rhino Rediscovery/Byron Preiss Publishing. He secured and curated a new foreword for the book from his friend **Sir George Martin**. Lewis wrote the 25,000-word 'companion narrative' for the new edition - continuing the Epstein story from April 1964 (where the book left off) - to his death in August 1967 and the long aftermath. He also contributed a tribute to his mentor **Derek Taylor** who had been Epstein's co-author in 1964. As part of his mission to restore, preserve and burnish Epstein's reputation and legacy, he instigated, created and continues to host the official Brian Epstein website - www.BrianEpstein.com

When he premiered his critically-acclaimed autobiographical one-man show "Great Exploitations! An Audience With Martin Lewis" in 2000 he confessed to a throwaway teenage prank in 1972 that three decades later had resulted in the titles of four dreadful Beatlesque songs he had composed as a 14-year-old schoolboy becoming part of Beatles folklore as if they were rare, genuine, unreleased Fab Four gems! He had incorporated his own song titles as a touch of literary padding into an otherwise scholarly article about unreleased Beatles recordings that he wrote for the weekly UK music paper Disc & Music Echo in 1972. Because all the other song titles and details disclosed in his article - many revealed in print for the first time - were accurate, other music writers and Beatles historians subsequently gave credence to the titles of the four fake tunes - and they eventually gained mythic status as the Holy Grail of lost Beatles songs! No one enjoyed his confession more than his old friend Sir George Martin who laughed heartily and told him how wealthy he'd have been if he had had a penny for every time fans had asked him about four unreleased Beatles tracks: "Colliding Circles," "Pink Litmus Paper Shirt," "Deck Chair" and "Left Is Right (And Right Is Wrong)"...
